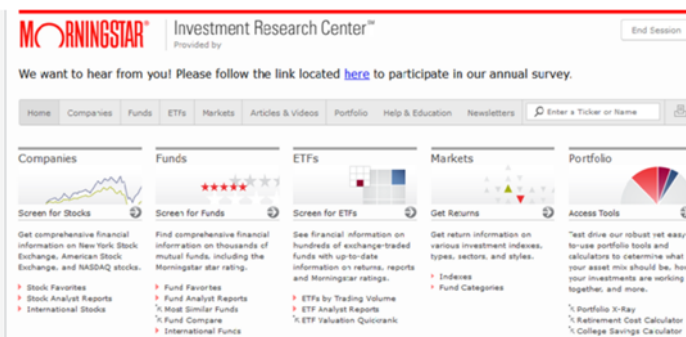
Lladros Collectibles for Sale
